### **Date Set for Faraway Bay's 2009 Kimberley Cooking School**

Chris said participants are involved in creating menus, which often focussed on the fresh fish caught that day.

"It could be anything from mackerel steaks, to trevally, the occasional mud crab or that elusive barramundi."

"There are plenty of tastings, ideas, and importantly lots of fun."

The four day Kimberley Cooking School package is an experience of a lifetime and includes:

- Accommodation in a cabin with extraordinary 180 degree views of the bay
- Sightseeing and excursions during the day including boating to the magnificent twin falls on the King George River, fishing, exploring ancient rock art and more.
